Basket or container must hold 100% of the exhibit and entries may not overflow to the display table. All horticulture must have been grown by the exhibitor. Polish may not be used on any item. This class will be judged on the American System. Youth will be judged separately from adult entries.

No premium awarded to exhibits not considered up to standard regardless of number of entries in the class
